### Certificate Program – 18 CEUs taken from the following group:

Students can earn a certificate in Historic Preservation by completing 18 Continuing Education Units (CEUs) in the following courses. The first course, Introduction to Historic Preservation, is required and will be offered at least twice a year. All of the courses will be offered two or three times a year on weekends and do not have to be taken in any order.

The dates indicate the most recent schedule and the courses listed for fall will be repeated in the spring or summer. Classes are not offered during December.
