



HISTORIC PRESERVATION SUMMER INSTITUTES EDGECOMBE COMMUNITY COLLEGE • TARBORO, NC MAY – AUGUST 2010

The Historic Preservation Trades program proposes to offer several summer institutes in the following areas. Each institute will meet for 4 full days of class, **Wednesday through Saturday from 8 AM to 5 PM**. The students will have intensive training in specific areas. Work will be done on an early 19th-century farmhouse in Eastern North Carolina.

Larry Waldrop, Historic Preservation Trades instructor at Edgecombe Community College, has historic preservation degrees from the University of Mary Washington and the North Bennet Street School. He has worked on historic preservation projects across the country, including National Historic Landmarks in Vermont, Massachusetts, and California.

Plaster Installation – May 19-22 OR June 2-5. This course will teach the history of plaster use in American buildings, the different types of plaster, and the appropriate tools to use. The students will receive hands-on training preparing walls, mixing, and applying the plaster.



Interior Millwork – August 4-7. This course will teach students about different woods used in historic structures and how to measure, create, and install interior woodwork including wainscoting, chair rail, window trim, and door trim.

Cost of the institutes is \$350, including tuition (\$120) and user fees (\$230). Each institute will carry 3.2 continuing education units that can be applied toward the certificate in Historic Preservation Trades.
